Beliefs about Summer Reading

- Reading during the summer should be a pleasure.
- There should be lots of choices during summer-reading time.
- Developing a reading life has both personal and academic benefits.

Reading is more fun when it's a social experience. Therefore, we want you and your child to read together. When family members read some of the same books, it's more likely that meaningful discussion and a love of reading will emerge. We also want reading to become a part of each child's daily life because it benefits the students and our school when they read voraciously. We want students to read books of their choice that capture their attention. The books listed on the back of this sheet are only suggestions. The important thing is to read, read, read...and that you and your child enjoy it!

How to Tell if a Book is Just Right for Your Child

When your child starts reading a book, he or she should ask the following questions:

- 1. Can I understand it?
- 2. Can I talk about it?
- 3. Does the topic interest me?

If your child answers "yes" to all three questions, the book is a good choice!
